Purpose

It has been brought to our attention that the number of entities being included in the lists of targeted entities subject to EU Restrictive Measures, UN Sanctions and US Sanctions, has significantly increased.

Consequently, it is imperative that all owners, bareboat charterers, managers, registration officers, Class Societies and Recognized Organizations of vessels flying the Sierra Leone flag, study thoroughly the below sanctions lists before entering into any agreement / transaction and before calling any Port of the said country.

Application

- 1. Sanctions / Restrictive Measures against Lebanon:
 - a. Council Regulation (EC) No. 1412/2006, of 25 September 2006, as amended, concerning certain restrictive measures in respect of Lebanon.
 - b. United Nations Security Council Resolution 1636 (2005), concerning Lebanon, of 31 October 2005, 1636 Sanctions Committee.
 - c. OFAC (Office of Foreign Assets Control) Lebanon Sanctions, as last updated by U.S. Department of the Treasury.
- 2. An updated consolidated version of the EU restrictive measures against the above mentioned country is set out at www.eur-lex.europa.eu.
- 3. Additionally, an updated list of all the European Union restrictive measures in force can be accessed at http://eeas.europa.eu/cfsp/sanctions/docs/measures en.pdf.

- 4. An updated UN sanctions list is set out on the United Nations website at https://www.un.org/sc/suborg/en.
- 5. An updated OFAC sanctions list is set out on the U.S. Department of the Treasury website at https://www.treasury.gov/resource-center/sanctions/Programs/Pages/Programs.aspx.
- 6. Alternatively, OFAC sanctions can be accessed from OFAC's Sanctions List Search at http://sdnsearch.ofac.treas.gov/.
- 7. It is recalled that EU, UN and US instruments have direct effect and are binding on the shipowners/ship operators and any violation may expose them to relevant penalties under legislations of the relevant bodies.
- 8. Ship Owners / Managers / Operators, Registration Officers (RegOffs), Recognised Organisations (ROs), are advised to abide by the prohibitions on transportation contained in the applicable EU, UN and US instruments, with respect to the above mentioned countries.
- 9. In light of the above, and in order to protect the Sierra Leone Flag's interests, Sierra Leone Maritime Administration SLMARAD, without any prejudice, reserves the right to take any actions deemed necessary against any vessel / owner / entity.
- 10. The above will enter into effect as of 12th January 2017.
